MISSION STATEMENT

NOA provides safe haven and support services for victims of family violence. Through educational programs, NOA works to foster attitudes in the community that violence is not acceptable.

Maria's Story

With very little but the clothes on their backs, Maria and her three school-aged children entered the NOA shelter having nowhere else to go and feeling unsure of their safety...



For adult and child survivors of domestic violence, the layers of trauma are many and varied: physical, emotional, psychological, sexual and financial. As a result, the cumulative and complex nature of trauma permeates all areas and aspects of life: parenting, self-esteem and maintaining healthy relationships.

Upon entrance to our program, their needs were many. Maria battled daily with anxiety and the very real fear of losing her children. Along with this fear was the profound awareness of what her children had seen and experienced while living in the midst of domestic violence.

How had the trauma impacted them? Was it irreversible? What kind of adults would her children grow up to be? Would they repeat the cycle of abuse?

Maria immersed herself in our services. Weekly therapeutic counseling allowed her space and time to begin processing and working through her own trauma and focused on Maria's strengths in providing safety and stability for her and her children. Support groups focusing on crucial life skills such as setting

healthy boundaries, budgeting, conflict resolution and living with depression and anxiety gave her practical tools to use daily in her journey.

The children participated weekly in a support group that allowed them to openly share what they had witnessed. Individual sessions with the children's advocate gave the children opportunity to name and process their feelings and build their emotional vocabulary. Ongoing advocacy addressed their educational, emotional and medical needs.

Now, after four months, Maria has obtained reliable transportation, is working part time and has moved out of the shelter into her own home. She and the children continue to participate in our services attending support groups, counseling and parent education.
