Our organization has been a beacon of hope, providing critical resources and advocacy for individuals and families affected by abuse. Through the tireless efforts of our team, volunteers, and supporters, we have strengthened our programs, expanded outreach, and helped empower countless lives to break free from the cycle of violence.

This year, we achieved a significant milestone with the completion of our new emergency shelter in 2025. This shelter stands as a testament to our commitment to providing safe spaces and immediate support for those in crisis. It marks a new chapter in our ability to serve our community and ensure that survivors have access to the care and resources they need to rebuild their lives.

We also witnessed an inspiring community coming together with compassion and resolve. From hosting educational workshops to organizing awareness campaigns, and providing safe spaces for those in need, our achievements are a testament to the collective commitment to end domestic violence. The partnerships and contributions from our supporters have been vital to our success, and we are deeply grateful for the trust and collaboration that continues to fuel our mission.

# NOA SERVED 3,198 women, children and men in 2024

The NOA crisis line is the first point of contact to reach much needed help, information and support. As victims turn to NOA for help, we are available 24/7/365 to listen, comfort, give hope and save lives. Every crisis call is an opportunity to intervene and assist. In 2024, **NOA advocates responded to 2,503 crisis calls.**

Victims of family violence need immediate safe shelter to escape violence and achieve stability. As a safe refuge, the NOA shelter provides a place of safety, healing, comfort and hope. **NOA sheltered 89 different people** (42 women, 45 children and 2 men) for a total of 3,532 bed nights. 25 clients were placed in local hotels due to lack of space.

## SERVICES PROVIDED

NOA helps vulnerable families protect, nurture, and care for their children. Case management, life skills groups, parenting classes, financial assistance, trauma counseling, legal advocacy and community referrals provide the help victims need to live stable and productive lives.

**Families were provided financial assistance totaling \$192,077.**

A paramount goal of the program is to reduce the risk of Post Traumatic Stress Disorder, depression, and other indicators of adverse effects of family violence so that families can heal together and regain a sense of control over their lives. Counseling is offered in a group setting as well as individual sessions by a licensed counselor. In 2024, **277 clients attended counseling sessions and 356 clients attended parent education and stress management groups.**


Using a holistic approach, NOA works with children and their non-offending parents to promote healthy relationships, coping skills and resilience. A primary goal of the children's program is to address the impact of traumatic stress which profoundly affects the development of children.

**In 2024, 160 children attended weekly support groups.**

By partnering with local law enforcement, our proactive approach fights family violence on all fronts. NOA reviews 9-1-1 calls/police reports and contacts the victim to develop a safety plan and offer services. Legal advocates are able to connect victims with life saving resources such as shelter, protective orders, court support, counseling and various other support services.

**Advocates assisted 348 victim resulting in protective orders in 2024.**




